

2005 Game Recaps



TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State gained 398 yards of total offense, including 260 in the air, but it was Eastern Illinois who converted two critical third quarter touchdowns as the Panthers controlled the second half and defeated the Sycamores 24-13 in the season opener for both teams.

With the score tied 10-10 at the intermission, Eastern Illinois took the lead on a 40-yard scoring pass from Mike Donato to Charles Owens that capped an eight-play, 86-yard drive for a touchdown lead with 8:00 minutes left in the third quarter.

Indiana State began the ensuing drive at its

own 30, and was driving down the field until Eastern Illinois' Tristan Burge picked off a Blayne Baggett pass and took the ball back 76 yards for a score and a 24-10 advantage.

ISU's Kyle Hooper rounded out the scoring with a 23-yard field goal with 49 seconds left in the third quarter. Hooper has now connected on each of his last 10 field goal tries dating back to last season.

With ISU trailing 24-13, the Sycamores gained the field position advantage by stopping Eastern Illinois on its first drive of the fourth quarter. But Andre Forte would fumble at the 50, giving the Panthers back the ball and the ability to control the field position battle for the remainder of the contest.

EIU punter Tom Schofield punted eight times for an average of 38.0 yards, and pinned the Sycamores inside their own 20 five times. Eastern opened the scoring with a 17-yard touchdown by Charles Owens to Mike Donato for a 7-0 lead with 11:47 remaining in the first quarter. Hooper kicked the first of his two field goals to cut the advantage to 7-3. EIU's Zach Yates added a field goal of his own for a 10-3 lead, before ISU tied the contest on a 34-yard touchdown pass to Matt Beste from Baggett.

Baggett was 32-of-54 on the night for 260 yards and a touchdown with three interceptions. Baggett's 32 pass completions tied an Indiana State school record also held by Jeff Miller, who connected on 32 passes vs. Ball State in 1985. He hit Jamie Petrowski, Sam Logan and Carl Berman with seven passes each as well as Markus Naves, who recorded five receptions.

Andre Forte rushed the ball 12 times for 63 yards in the contest. Defensively, Kyle James was the leading tackler for ISU with seven total stops. James also forced a fumble on the evening. Darryl Morton and Warren English-Malone each recorded a fumble recovery in the game.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State University (0-2) dropped a decisive 42-10 decision to NAIA St. Francis (Ind.) (1-0) at home in what turned into a stunner for the 3,160 fans in attendance at Memorial Stadium. The Cougars reached the NAIA national championship contest one year ago, and showed impressive speed and skill to down its first NCAA Division I-AA opponent in school history.

Indiana State surrendered 409 yards of total offense in the contest, giving up 28 second-half points after the score was a tight 14-10 at the

half. USF's Cory Jacquay opened the scoring with a five-yard burst to put the Cougars up 7-0 with 7:14 showing on the first quarter clock. ISU's Kyle Hooper countered with 3:06 remaining in the first as he booted a 36-yard field goal to inch the Sycamores closer at 7-3. With the make, Hooper has connected on each of last 11 field goal attempts dating back to last year's game against SMS (now Missouri State).

St. Francis would add another score with 11 seconds remaining in the first quarter on a six-yard run by Adam Denning to put the Cougars up 14-3.

Andre Forte found the end zone with 4:02 remaining in the first half as he bolted in from three yards out to get ISU back within four at 14-10. The Sycamores drove down to USF's territory on its final drive of the half, but the clock expired before ISU could get within field goal range.

The second half was all USF as they stopped the Sycamores on a three-and-out after ISU's first second half possession. They then blocked a Phillip Johnson punt and Chris Schmitt scooped the loose ball up at the 20 yard line and raced to the end zone to put the Cougars up 21-10.

Sycamore quarterback Blayne Baggett was 25-of-40 passing for 243 yards in the contest. He found Sam Logan and Forte a team-high six times each. Forte carried the ball 12 times for 72 yards with the touchdown.

For USF, Jacquay rushed for 94 yards and two TDs while Michael Ledo amassed 80 yards on the ground. Quarterback Chris Trammell was 10-of-14 with an interception and 118 yards in the contest.

MURRAY, Ky. — Nick Turner returned a kickoff 91 yards for a touchdown, threw a TD pass and ran for a third score to lead Murray State to a 27-15 win over Indiana State.

Turner rushed for 86 yards for the Racers (1-1), who came back from an early 10-0 deficit. Kyle Hooper opened the scoring with a 23-yard field goal four minutes into the game. Blayne Baggett threw a 6-yard TD pass to Sam Logan six minutes later for a 10-0 Indiana State lead.

Baggett completed a school-record 33 passes in the effort while also attempting a school-most 58. He threw for 262 yards in the contest.

Baggett had tied the school-record with 32 pass completions in the season opener against Eastern Illinois. He is the first ISU quarterback to pass for over 200 yards in each of his first three games as a Sycamore.

Logan finished with a school-record 17 catches for 151 yards. Those 17 receptions also are a Gateway Football Conference single-game record, besting the previous mark of 16, set by Northern Iowa's Eddie Galles against Southern Illinois in 2003.

He entered the contest with 13 total receptions on the season. His total of 30 through three games is 25 shy of the school-record 55 receptions he tallied in 2004. After Logan's touchdown, Turner got the Racers on the board with his long return.

Hooper kicked a 40-yard field goal in the final minute of the opening quarter to give the Sycamores a 13-7 lead. He has now connected on each of his last 13 attempts. Hooper is a perfect 5-for-5 on the season.

ISU expanded its lead to 15-7 when Murray State's Ken Topps slipped in his own end zone for a safety. Madison Miller and Kyle Mitchell combined for the sack of Topps. Mitchell recorded a pair of sacks in the contest, which upped his career total to 23 – just one off the career school-record.

Turner, a senior running back, found Mauri Marchman for a 71-yard pass play with 8:11 left in the first half and added a 5-yard touchdown run seven minutes later to give the Racers the lead for good.

Chad Cook had a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter. The Sycamores outgained the Racers 457-354, but had 14 penalties and converted only 5 of 18 third downs.

LUBBOCK, Texas — Indiana State hung tough with I-A Big 12 Conference opponent Texas Tech on their home field in the early going, but the Red Raiders proved worthy of their No. 16 national ranking as they rolled to a 63-7 victory over Indiana State at Jones SBC Stadium. With ISU trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, senior Rocky Alo intercepted a pass by Cody Hodges, but fumbled on the return.

After that possession, Texas Tech rattled off 42 consecutive points in the first half en route to the victory. Indiana State scored its lone touchdown of the contest at the 4:12 mark of

the fourth quarter when Blayne Baggett found Jamie Petrowski for a five-yard touchdown pass. Texas Tech opened the scoring with an 11-play, 89-yard yard drive on their second possession of the contest which ended with a Taurean Henderson three-yard run for a touchdown with 7:32 remaining in the first quarter. Following the second Sycamore punt of the contest, TTU quarterback Cody Hodges was intercepted by senior Rocky Alo at the Raider 39-yard line, but he fumbled when tackled by Hodges on the 29.

The Raiders were able to capitalize on the ISU mistake with a five-yard drive that ended with Henderson reaching the end zone for the second time in the contest. Henderson broke several Sycamore tackles and squirted through the line of scrimmage for a 44-yard rush that gave TTU a 14-0 advantage with 7:32 remaining in the first quarter. Henderson continued his stellar outing on the ensuing drive as he capped a nine-play, 82-yard scoring march with a six-yard run at the 12:46 mark in the second quarter. The touchdown gave TTU a 21-0 lead, with the Raiders reaching the end zone on three of its four possessions.

The Red Raiders would go on to score 28 points in the final 12 minutes of the second quarter. Hodges tossed touchdown passes to Jarrett Hicks and two to Joel Filani for a 42-0 lead. The first half scoring ended when Phillip Johnson's punt was blocked by Brandon Douglas and returned two yards for the TD and a 49-0 advantage at the half. Texas Tech would add just two more scores in the second half, to produce the final tally, 63-7. Blayne Baggett led ISU in passing, as he completed 16-of-32 passes for 120 yards in the contest. The Sycamores' leading rusher was Andre Forte, who finished with 17 attempts for 65 yards. Petrowski recorded a teamhigh five receptions for 44 yards and the Sycamores' lone score. Junior Sam Logan, who caught a league and school-record 17 passes one week ago at Murray State, was held without a catch for the first time this season. It broke a string of 14 consecutive games with a pass reception for Logan.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State took the lead in the fourth quarter over No. 3 Western Kentucky, but the Hilltopper rushing attack proved too much as the Sycamores fell 38-28 in the first Gateway contest of the season. ISU rolled up an impressive 490 yards of total offense but it was not enough to overcome 293 rushing yards by WKU.

WKU posted 521 total yards but the Sycamores were equally impressive in the offensive slugfest. ISU racked up 365 yards through the air. Blayne Baggett went 32-of-53 for 297 yards from the QB position and the Sycamores completed three passes on fake kicks. Phillip Johnson was two-for-two on fake punt attempts for 61 yards, and Sam Logan passed for a seven yard TD on a fake FG. But at the end of the game, the WKU rushing

attack took its toll on the Sycamore defense as the Hilltoppers scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to overcome a 28-24 deficit and earn the win.

Western Kentucky took control of the game early as it scored on its first play from scrimmage on a 73-yard pass from Haddix to Maurice Perkins to take a 7-0 lead just 16 seconds into the game. The Hilltoppers' Dan Cline then picked off a Blayne Baggett pass on the Sycamores' first play to regain possession on the ISU 30-yard line. Haddix and Perkins tried to make it two TD's in two plays, but the pass was over the head of an open Perkins. The Sycamores answered with a big play as the defense forced a fumble by Lerron Moore to halt the WKU momentum. ISU then marched the ball down the field and tied the score, 7-7, on a 28-yard scamper by Cornel Johnson to finish off a seven-play drive that covered 75-yards.

The Sycamores held the Hilltoppers on their next possession to force a punt and ISU again put together a sustained drive. However, it was not without a little trickery as ISU used a 28-yard pass by Phillip Johnson on a fake punt to keep the drive going. Indiana State also converted a second fourth down play later on the drive. But the third time the Sycamores rolled the dice on fourth down the Hilltoppers would not budge and the ISU drive was stopped on the five-yard line. WKU responded with an impressive 14-play drive that covered 95 yards and regained a 14-7 lead on a Haddix two-yard plunge. The Hilltoppers held the ball for 5:52 during the possession, which saw WKU use 11 running plays for 90 yards. But ISU did not back down as they again marched down the field behind the passing of Baggett and tied the score on a 15-yard touchdown pass to Jamie Petrowski on the eighth play of the drive. Baggett completed five-of-six attempts on the possession, which knotted the score at 14-14. The Sycamore defense stepped up and made a stop on the next WKU possession and gave the ball back to the offense at the 34-yard line. ISU moved the ball down to the seven yard line, where the Hilltoppers stopped the Sycamores and forced ISU to line up for a field goal. But ISU converted on its second fake kick of the day as Sam Logan found Andy Jones wide open for a seven-yard TD and a 21-14 advantage, which ISU maintained heading into halftime.

WKU drew first blood in the second half with a 25-yard field goal by Chris James on its first possession of the half to cut the Sycamore lead to 21-17. The Hilltoppers then forced an ISU punt after four plays and the WKU offense was back on the attack. A two-yard score by Lerron Moore culminated a 12 play, 64-yard WKU drive to give them its first lead since the early going, 24-21.

The Sycamores looked like they had another drive stall on the 43-yard line, but Phillip Johnson's second converted pass on a fake punt in the game went for 33 yards on 4th-and-15 to keep the ISU offense on the field. ISU eventually punched it in the end zone on a one-yard run by Cornel Johnson as the Sycamores went back up, 28-24. The ISU drive finished with 15-plays and covered 74 yards.

WKU did not mess around on its next possession, as they went 78 yards on three plays, to score what turned out to be the gamewinning touchdown on a 47-yard pass from Haddix to Jamison Link. The TD gave the Hilltoppers a 31-28 lead and after stopping ISU, the opposition would add the final score on a 30-yard Haddix strike to Curtis Hamilton.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Youngstown State scored 35 first half points and didn't look back as they ran away with a 45-0 victory in Gateway Football Conference play at Memorial Stadium.

It did not take Youngstown long to take the lead as the Penguins scored on their first possession going 58 yards on three plays in 50 seconds.

After the Sycamores failed to get a first down, YSU took over and again went down the field pushing the score to 14-0 after a two-yard TD by Monquantae Gibson.

The ISU defense held Youngstown on their next two possessions, but then the Penguin rushing attack started to take its toll. YSU put together an impressive 12-play, 90 yard drive that took 5:28 off the clock to push the lead to 21-0.

After the next ISU drive stalled, the Penguins used a nice punt return to get the ball in great field possession as they only needed 22 yards to punch in its next score. The final tally of the first half came with just 27 seconds remaining in the period and gave YSU a 35-0 lead.

The Sycamores moved the ball quite effectively in the first half as they registered 150 yards of total offense, but were unable to sustain a scoring drive. ISU also was hurt by an interception and three penalties.

The second half turned into a defensive struggle as the only scoring was a YSU 39-yard field goal at the start of the fourth quarter and a 24-yard TD run with 1:27 remaining in the game to push the final score to 45-0.

The Sycamores finished with 269 total yards of offense, which included 210 yards through the air. Senior QB Blayne Baggett was 15 of 26 for 177 yards.

Carl Berman was the main receiving target as he hauled in five catches for 109 yards. Martuan Sample led the Sycamore ground game with 55 yards on seven carries.

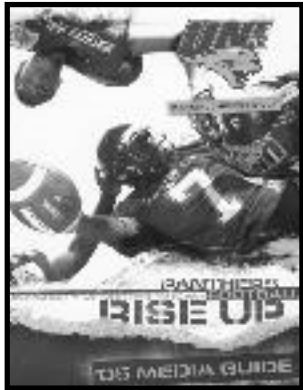

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa — ISU had revenge on the mind after UNI rolled into Memorial Stadium and defeated the Sycamores by a score of 58-6 during the Trees' 2004 Homecoming.

It was Homecoming at UNI this year, but the Panthers were able to hold onto a tight contest, and pull away in the second half for a 31-10 Gateway Football Conference victory. Northern Iowa raced to a quick 7-0 lead with 10:41 left in the first quarter when tailback Terrance Freeney plunged into the end zone from one yard out on a fourth and goal play. The Panthers started the drive at the ISU 34-yard line after receiving a short Sycamore punt.

After the Sycamore offense failed to get a first down on its next possession, the Panthers went back to work and moved the ball down to the ISU six yard line in just three plays. Junior defensive back Warren English-Malone thwarted that score with his third interception of the season to hold the UNI advantage to 7-0.

ISU was able to move the ball into the UNI red zone, but on a third-and-long, senior quarterback Blayne Baggett bobbled the snap out of the shotgun and the Sycamores lost possession. Early on in the next drive senior defensive end Kyle Mitchell recovered a UNI fumble to regain possession. The Sycamores held onto the ball for 14 plays and 74 yards as the drive ended with a 16-yard field goal from junior kicker Kyle Hooper to inch the Sycamores closer at 7-3 with 5:46 remaining in the first half.

UNI's David Horne had the answer for the Panthers and he raced in from 40 yards out give UNI a 14-3 lead with 4:30 remaining in the half. Indiana State once again got near the red zone, but time ran out on the Sycamores before they could get any points before the half.

Following the half, UNI took the kickoff and marched down the field to the ISU eight-yard line where kicker Brian Wingert kicked a 25 yard field goal to extend the advantage out to 17-3. The Sycamores would answer with their first points of the second half as Baggett found sophomore wide receiver Ben Schmidt for his first career touchdown reception, a 20-yard catch, to inch closer at 17-10 with 6:51 left in the third quarter.

Mitchell would recover another UNI fumble with just over four minutes remaining in the third period to stop a UNI scoring drive that moved just inside the ISU 10. After the Trees went three-and-out, UNI once again moved inside the 10-yard line as time wound down in the third period. This time, they reached the end zone and extended their lead to 24-10 with 48 seconds left before the final stanza on a seven-yard run by quarterback Dexter Hill.

Baggett finished the contest with a 25-for-42 passing mark for 241 yards. Baggett's 25 pass completions, give him 178 for the season, which is a new school record. The old mark was 176 which was set by Jeff Miller during the 1985 season. Andre Forte was the Sycamores' leading rusher with 20 yards while Jamie Petrowski caught a game-best six passes for 57 yards. Sam Logan caught five as well, while Forte also added five receptions of his own. Defensively, Mitchell had two key fumble recoveries in the contest.

UNI's Horne and Freeney each rushed for over 100 yards in the contest. It was the first time since the 2004 home victory over Murray State, that the Sycamores had allowed a pair of 100-yard rushers in a single contest.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — After two seasons of dropping its Homecoming contests by wide margins to some of the nation's top-ranked NCAA Division I-AA teams, Indiana State held its own against No. 10 Southern Illinois, before falling 42-20.

The Salukis used 14 fourth quarter points to reach the final margin of victory. ISU had a banner day offensively; with senior quarterback Blayne Baggett tossing for 289 yards, hitting 32-of-45 attempts. He passed for two scores, finding Carl Berman on a pair of touchdown strikes in the contest. Berman scored on catches of 10 and 42 yards.

Southern Illinois took the opening kickoff and drove the ball 81 yards in 13 plays as Antoine Jackson scored on fourth-and-goal from the Sycamore one-yard line with 9:11 remaining in the first quarter to stake Southern to a quick 7-0 advantage. The Sycamores answered as Baggett found Berman on a 10-yard TD with 6:10 showing in the first period, to even the score at seven.

SIU opened up the space in the score that it would need at the end with a pair of TD strikes from quarterback Joel Sambursky – a 21-yarder to Brent Little and a 7-yarder to J.T. Wise – which put the Salukis up 21-7 with 4:29 left in the first half.

Baggett hit Berman in stride for a 42-yard pitch with 2:38 left before the half to inch ISU closer at 21-14. The halftime spread would prove to be 14 points when Alan Turner caught a 10-yard pass from Sambursky with just over 30 seconds left in the half for the 28-14 lead at the break. ISU used a pair of Kyle Hooper field goals, one from 27 and a career-long from 47, to get the margin within one score at 28-20 with 10:23 left in the game. SIU's Arkee Whitlock took control over the final 10 minutes, scoring on a two-yard run and a 19-yard run to boost Southern to a 42-20 victory.

On defense, ISU senior defensive end Kyle Mitchell recorded seven tackles, including four solos and 3.5 tackles for loss as well as a sack in the effort. Mitchell's fourth quarter sack of Sambursky gave him 24.5 for his career – which is a new ISU record. He added a forced fumble and fumble recovery in the game.

Berman had nine catches for 102 yards and two TDs in the contest. This was the second time this season that Berman has reached the 100-yard receiving mark. Andre Forte rushed for 104 yards in the contest, going over 100 for the second time as well this season. Hooper was 2-of-4 kicking on the day, hitting from 47 and 27 while missing from 42 and 33 yards. He had his string of 14 consecutive made field goals broken in the game's second quarter, but has hit 16 of his last 18 attempts.

Sam Logan caught six passes for 79 yards in the contest, giving him 52 pass receptions for the season. He needs just three more to tie his own school record of 55 receptions set last year.

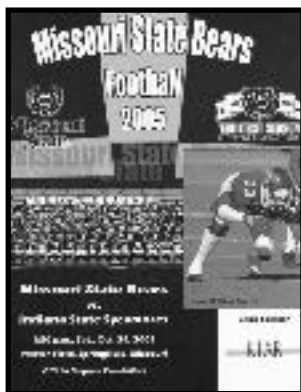

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. — For the second time this season, Indiana State took a fourth quarter lead over a Gateway Football Conference opponent, but for the second time they came up short as Missouri State scored with 28 seconds remaining to take a 31-27 victory over the Sycamores.

Junior wide receiver Sam Logan tied his own school record with 55 catches on the season in the game's first quarter. The record-tying catch was a 40-yard pass from senior quarterback Blayne Baggett for a touchdown which gave the Sycamores a 7-0 cushion with 7:07 left in the game's first quarter. Logan would break the record with his 56th catch of the season on a three-yard reception in the second period.

Missouri State answered the early Logan touchdown with a three-yard run by quarterback Scott Carroll at the 1:55 mark of the first quarter. The Sycamore defense had all of Carroll's options covered, but he found a seam up the middle and scooted into the end zone for the TD which tied the score at seven. The two teams traded field goals early in the second quarter when Kyle Hooper booted a 27-yarder with 14:51 left in the period before MSU's Jon Scifres booted a 22-yard field goal of his own to knot the score at 10. The Bears were able to forge ahead with 6:07 left in the first half when backup quarterback A.J. Porter found Michael Sparks on a 13-yard catch-and-run for the score and a 17-10 lead.

ISU was able to move the ball inside the MSU 30-yard line with just over a minute remaining, but an illegal forward pass and a sack of Baggett ended the Sycamores hopes of knotting the score before the half.

Following a defensive stand to begin the second half, the Sycamore offense marched from inside its own one-yard line for a score when Logan caught a 32-yard pass and raced into the end zone to tie the score at 17 with 8:51 remaining in the third quarter. Scifres booted a perfect punt that was downed at the one, but a personal foul on MSU gave ISU improved field position at the 16-yard line. Eleven plays later, Logan caught the scoring pass from Baggett. The score gave Logan the first multi-touchdown game of his career. ISU took its first second-half lead since the Western Kentucky contest when Baggett found Carl Berman for a six-yard touchdown with 14:51 remaining in the contest. The scoring play gave the Sycamores a 24-17 advantage, with Baggett going over 300 yards passing for the first time this season during the drive.

The Indiana State defense held their ground with the lead, giving the ball back to the Sycamore offense just outside its own 20-yard line. During the drive, Baggett completed a screen pass to Jamie Petrowski, but he fumbled to give the Bears excellent field position. Porter took advantage of the situation as he reached the end zone on a six-yard TD run to even the score at 24.

ISU marched down the field in putting together a 7-play, 48-yard drive that ended with a 26-yard field goal by Hooper which gave ISU a 27-24 lead with 7:03 remaining in the contest. On Missouri State's final drive, Kaya Farris made an amazing over-the-shoulder catch in the end zone on a pass from A.J. Porter to take the final lead, 31-27. The score came with 28 seconds remaining.

ISU could not muster a first down on their final drive as ISU dropped its 15th consecutive contest. Baggett hit 32-of-48 passes for a school-record 396 yards and three touchdowns. Logan finished the game with 13 receptions for 194 yards and two scores.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Indiana State recorded its most points of the season, but the Sycamore defense could not find an answer to a potent Western Illinois offense that racked up 63 points and over 600 yards of total offense in a 63-35 victory over ISU on Senior Day at Memorial Stadium.

Senior quarterback Blayne Baggett found junior wide receiver Carl Berman on a scoring pass to cap the Sycamores' first drive and stake ISU to a quick 7-0 lead with 11:25 left in the first quarter.

Western Illinois' Travis Glasford scored back-to-back rushing touchdowns to give the Leathernecks a 14-7 lead midway through the first period.

The Leatherneck lead would grow on a Steve LaFalce pass to Carl Sims for a 21-7 advantage with two minutes showing on the first quarter game clock. Junior Cornell Johnson tied a school-record on the ensuing kickoff with a 97-yard touchdown to get ISU back within one score at 21-14 just before the end of the first quarter. Western added a score of their own on a LaFalce run, then Baggett hooked up Berman for another score to get ISU within striking distance at 28-21.

The Leathernecks went on to score the next 28 points in the contest, with Baggett finding Sam Logan for a five-yard touchdown to inch the Sycamores closer at 56-28 late in the third quarter. Baggett tossed his fourth score of the contest, when he found Ben Schmidt on a 27-yard score early in the fourth quarter before Western tacked on a final TD for a 63-35 win.

Baggett set a career-high with four touchdown passes in the contest, as he tossed for 353 yards. It was the second week in a row that Baggett eclipsed the 300-yard passing mark.

ISU was paced in receptions by Berman, who caught 11 balls for 78 yards in the contest. Logan went over the 100-yard mark for the seventh time in his career, with eight catches for 165 yards and a TD.

Cornell Johnson had two kickoff returns for 107 yards, including the 97-yard return for a TD in the second quarter. It was ISU's first kickoff return for a touchdown since the 2002 season opener when Soso Dede had a 95-yarder at Western Michigan.

NORMAL, III. — For the first time since the 1951 season, the Indiana State Sycamores will not win a football game. ISU broke out to a 7-0 lead early in the contest, but Illinois State's high-powered offense was just too much as they burst out with 42 first half points en route to a 70-28 victory. Indiana State's season ends at 0-11, while the 'Birds finish off a 7-4 campaign.

ISU senior Andre Forte ended his career with a solid outing, rushing 15 times for 103 yards.

Forte scored the game's first touchdown of the day with a nine-yard run to spot ISU to its early 7-0 lead with 12:40 remaining in the first quarter. Illinois State would go on to rattle off the next 35 points as they took a 35-7 advantage.

Forte continued to be ISU's featured offensive weapon as he inched the Sycamores closer at 35-14 with 4:07 remaining before halftime with a 17-yard touchdown run. Illinois State would re-up its lead before the half as they made it a 42-14 spread on a 14-yd pass from Luke Drone to Jason Horton with just over a minute remaining before the break.

Junior kicker Kyle Hooper entered the contest having made 8-of-10 field goal attempts, but missed each of his attempts in the contest.

In the second half, Illinois State added a pair of touchdowns in the game's third quarter and two more in the fourth to go up 70-14 in the game's final period. Indiana State added a pair of scores in the waning minutes of the contest on a five-yard TD pass from Baggett and a six-yard TD run by Forte to make the final score 70-28.

Forte went over 100 yards rushing for the third time this season with his 142-yard rushing effort. ISU's leading receiver was Carl Berman who finished the contest with three catches for 16 yards.

Indiana State finishes the season without a win for the first time since 1951. Despite the winless season, the Sycamores re-set virtually every offensive passing record and Blayne Baggett and Sam Logan each put their names in the school and Gateway Football Conference records.

Logan finished the season with 77 catches, a school record and Baggett set the school and conference records for completions.
