The accounting major at Indiana State University includes nine courses in areas such as financial and cost accounting, federal income taxation, accounting systems, and auditing theory and practice. A minor in accounting can be obtained by taking 12 hours of accounting courses. Our forensic accounting minor provides the necessary accounting investigative skills to detect and prevent fraud. In addition to basic accounting courses required for the major, the forensic accounting minor also includes courses in fraud examination, criminal law and procedures, and criminal investigation.
