To be eligible for graduation and certification, business education majors must meet the following minimum standards:

- Complete all required courses (minimum of 128 credits).
- Complete the functional block and capstone courses with an average of 2.25 or higher.
- Complete at least 50 credits at the 300-400 level.
- Complete BEIT 492 with a grade of C+ or higher.
- Complete all courses in the major with a 2.50 grade point average or higher and achieve a g.p.a. of 2.50 or higher for all courses taken.
- Complete BEIT 307, 317, 320, 336 and 337 with a 2.50 or higher g.p.a. for this block of courses with no grade lower than a C for each course.
- Complete each course in Phases I, II, and III of the Professional Education sequence with a grade of C or higher and achieve a g.p.a. of 2.50 or higher for all of these courses.
- Pass Praxis II at the minimum level of competency or higher.
- Complete Student Teaching satisfactorily.
