Minor Requirements

- *Second year of a foreign language*
(201 and 202 language course at ISU or the equivalent) 6 hours
- *HIST 102* (Studies in World Civilization since 1500) 3 hours
- *Two of the three courses:*
 - PSCI 280 (Introduction to Comparative Politics) or
PSCI 370 (International Politics) 6 hours
 - ECON 100 (Basic Economics/ECON 100I when offered)
 - ENVI 130 (World Cultures and Environments)
- *Thematic or Area Concentration* 9 hours
Three courses at the 300 or 400 level with a regional or thematic focus, approved by IS advisor
- *Study abroad experience or research paper* in approved 400-level course 0 hours
- *IS 490:* Culminating, self-reflective project 1 hour

TOTAL: 25 hours
