

Q&A about ISU-Journey

- Who is eligible for the ISU Journey program?

Any ISU student with sophomore standing or above, from any major and with demonstrated interest in working with youth.

- What is the length of commitment for a Journey Fellowship?

Fellows commit to a minimum of one year, beginning with the Fall semester.

- How much will the Fellowship cost me?

It will cost you very little. Most activity costs are covered by the program, including transportation to events, retreat expenses and conference registration fees.

- What support will I receive with my internship?

Fellows are given a stipend to help them with expenses while on their internship, and help will be available to prepare, locate and secure an internship in a youth serving agency.

- How much time am I expected to commit to the program?

Activities will average about one per month plus an organization meeting. In addition, there is a youth work exploration experiences requirement of 10 hours per month during the academic year prior to the internship.

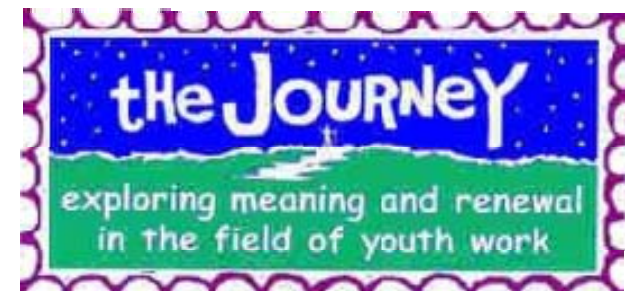
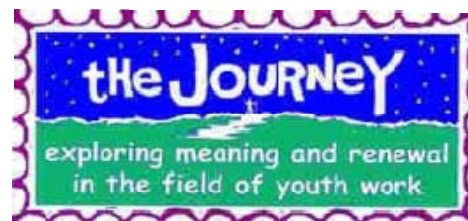

Indiana State University has partnered with Leadership and Renewal Outfitters, through a grant from the Lilly Endowment, to offer a Journey Fellowship certificate granting program for college students interested in careers working with youth.

Journey is about helping students from a variety of academic disciplines reflect on who they are while learning about and exploring various career opportunities available for serving young people.

Benefits of the Program

- Engage in self-exploration and become more aware of personal values, passions and interests, particularly as they relate to working with youth.
- Participate in practical experiences in the community working with youth and youth-serving agencies.
- Network and build relationships with other fellows, faculty, and youth work professionals from a variety of fields who share similar interests.



- Learn about and access resources on and off campus, locally and regionally, to make the college experience more meaningful and enhance your career potential in youth work.
- Become more knowledgeable of real-world challenges and opportunities in youth work fields while gaining the grounding and skills necessary to be successful.

The Journey Fellowship

A one-year program of experiences and activities that culminates in a summer internship in a youth serving agency.

- Apply and interview with ISU-Journey leadership team.
- Attend a fun, empowering Fall weekend retreat on September 28-30, 2007.
- Participate in the Journey student fellowship organization meetings and activities.
- Attend off-campus learning events, such as state or regional professional youth work conferences and field trips.
- Gather exploration experiences working with local youth work agencies.
- Keep a journal of your experiences.
- Attend a Spring retreat for reflection, evaluation and internship preparation.
- Enroll in a summer internship that contains a substantial youth work component.
