Indiana State University maintains a 24-hour public safety operation located at 210 North 6th Street between Erickson and Pickerl Halls. The Public Safety Department has 25 full-time police officers. Police officers employed by the Public Safety Department exercise full police authority and enforce federal and state laws, as well as University policies. Officers also have arrest powers on any property owned, leased, or used by Indiana State University. In addition, through a special agreement with the Vigo County Sheriff, officers exercise authority throughout Vigo County. The Public Safety Department maintains a strong working relationship with other university police agencies and local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.

Minimum Qualifications

- Minimum age of 21
- High school diploma or equivalent and one year college course work in criminal justice or related field; or an equivalent combination of education and experience
- Must possess a valid drivers license
- Must be able to pass a personal and criminal history background investigation
- Must be able to complete the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy within one year of employment
- Must be able to pass the physical standards test required by the Indiana Law Enforcement

Salary and Employee Benefits

- \$34,114 starting salary
- \$35,114 after Academy graduation
- \$38,114 after 2 years
- 12 days of sick leave after 90 day introductory period.
- 10 days of vacation after 90 day introductory period.
- 1 Convenience day after 90 day introductory period.
- Staff may take up to 15 hours of classes each year at the rate of \$31.00 hour after 90 day introductory period,
- Staff's dependent children who are full-time (12+ hours) are eligible for a 80 percent fee waiver for up to 10 semesters after 1 year of employment.
