RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING WARREN M. ANDERSON SCHOLARSHIP 2013 – 2014

- 1. The Warren M. Anderson Scholarship is offered to a limited number of entering freshmen who have demonstrated superior academic performance in high school. To retain this scholarship, the student must:
- A. enroll as a full-time student each semester (minimum of 12 credits) and successfully complete a minimum of 30 credit hours each academic year. This will enable the student to successfully progress toward graduation within four years.
- B. File FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by Indiana State deadline of March 10th.
- C. maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 as measured at the end of each academic year for the duration of eligibility.
- 2. The Warren M. Anderson Scholarship is good for a total of eight consecutive semesters of enrollment, or the point at which a student earns his/her first undergraduate degree.
- 3. A student who withdraws or discontinues enrollment for one or more semesters may request renewal for a future semester by writing to the University Scholarship Office <u>before</u> withdrawing. The petition form is available at <u>www.indstate.edu/scholarships/petition.htm</u> The request should state the student's name (including any changes), student identification number, reason(s) for withdrawal, and the semester he/she is planning to re-enroll. Students who withdraw or discontinue full-time yearly enrollment without filing a written request asking for a reinstatement of the scholarship will forfeit their scholarship. Once the scholarship is lost, it cannot be reinstated.
- 4. Semesters in which a student enrolls are charged against the offer regardless of completion of classes, incomplete grades, or no grades.
