There will be opportunities to learn about the significant role of women in Cuban society and politics and also about Cuba's evolving relationship with the world, and especially the U.S under the Obama administration. While studying at the University of Havana, students will live in a traditional Cuban neighborhood and will participate in side trips to Pinar del Rio's Viñales World Heritage site. You will be able to experience first-hand Cuban culture-- food, music, arts and culture-- in the heart of the country.
