HOW TRANSCRIPTS ARE PROCESSED

- Transcripts are sent to Admissions
- Admissions Data Processing will key in courses
- Admissions sends keyed in data to ORR
- ORR runs an automated process to fill in courses currently in our articulation table
- Courses not currently in our articulation table are given an elective code by ORR (Ex. ARTS001/ARTH002)
- ORR sends a spreadsheet of names of newly processed credit to campus stakeholders
- If a student changes Colleges, the intake College can re-evaluate the transfer credit.

HOW ARTICULATIONS ARE MADE

- Articulation Table: A master list of courses updated by ORR and used to automatically fulfill degree requirements. Ex. Ivy Tech ENGL112 = ISU ENG105
- Campus stakeholders work each day to review course descriptions and syllabi to update articulations
- Process varies from College to College
- When an articulation is updated, it applies to that student and each student after transferring the same course.
- Core Transfer Library statewide transfer articulations

APPLYING EXCEPTIONS

- MySAM exceptions are a way to manually override the system and complete or adjust degree requirements that don't automatically happen.
- Colleges typically have domain over the students in their majors when it comes to making MySAM exceptions.
- For Foundational Studies, Dean Maule would need to be consulted for exceptions.



STGEC AND TSAP

- Statewide Transfer General Education Core a block of 30 transferrable hours in the student's Foundational Studies category
- <u>Transfer Single Articulation Pathway</u> allows a student who completes an associate degree in a particular area to transfer that block of work, without alteration, to a related degree at the fouryear institution

FINAL TRANSCRIPT ISSUES

- "Where is my associate's degree?"
 "Why aren't my spring/fall/summer semester classes showing up on my MySAM?"
 "Why can't I register? I'm getting a transcript error
 - "Why can't I register? I'm getting a transcript error message"
 - → Student likely needs to submit an updated transcript to Admissions.
- "Why didn't I get credit for my ____ class?"
 - → Student maybe earned a C- or lower. Transfer credit must be grade C or above.
 - → Transferred developmental math courses should check off pre-requisites but not always.

ADVISING ISSUES

- Transfer students aren't always as self-reliant as we assume.
- Encourage 300/400 level courses
- Encourage students to submit high school transcripts and AP scores
