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# Appointments: They're Quick!

- Registration appointments are typically 15-30 minutes in length and will go quickly; this means students must be prepared for their meeting
- When you arrive for your appointment you should have a list of possible courses for spring 2019; remember, *you'll* guide the conversation
- Students who arrive late or are unprepared may be asked to reschedule

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# How to Prepare

- You should review your MySam Worksheet and MySam Plan and come up with a list of 6-8 possible courses to prepare for your registration appointment
- You can access MySam through your MyISU Portal via the Degree Audit Tools link

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# How to Prepare

- You should start by reviewing your MySam degree audit worksheet
- Your worksheet is the page that automatically loads when you log in and lists your required courses. Foundational Studies are listed first followed by your major specific requirements

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# How to Prepare

- If a particular semester isn't listed in the pop-up window the course is most likely not offered. However, your advisor can verify this during your appointment
- Tip: this feature can ease anxiety as registration approaches. Once you've completed your registration appointment and have your approved list of courses you can check your MySam Worksheet to verify if seats are still available as your registration date approaches.



# How to Prepare

- After reviewing your worksheet you should click on the Plans tab to review the plan your advisor has created for you.
- Remember, the Plan is a starting point; some courses can be rearranged depending on your interests and requirements.
