APPOINTMENTS: THEY'RE QUICK!

- Registration appointments are typically 30 minutes in length and will go quickly; this means you *must* be prepared for your meeting.
- When you sign-in for your appointment you must have a list of possible courses for Spring 2021; remember, you'll guide the conversation.
- Students who sign-in late or are unprepared may be asked to reschedule.

- You should review your MySam Worksheet and MySam Plan to prepare for your registration appointment.
- You can access MySam through your MyISU Portal as follows: Student Self-service → MySAM (at bottom left.)

HOW TO PREPARE:

- You should start by reviewing your MySam degree audit worksheet.
- Your worksheet is the page that automatically loads when you log in, and lists your required courses. Foundational Studies are listed first, followed by your major-specific requirements.

- Once in your MySam Worksheet, check to verify any transfer hours, current earned hours, and holds. If you're expecting a transfer credit that's not listed, follow up with your advisor immediately.
- Pay attention to your holds and make sure to resolve them prior to registration.
- I cannot emphasize this enough, especially with immunizations holds that, sometimes, require the administration of 2 separate injections spaced a month (or more) apart.
- If you wait too late to have this resolved by Priority Registration, you will not be able to participate and, therefore, will likely not be able to get the schedule you hoped for or need.



HOW TO PREPARE:

- If a particular semester isn't listed in the pop-up window, the course is most likely not offered that semester. However, your advisor can verify this during your appointment.
- **Tip:** This feature can ease anxiety as registration approaches. Once you've completed your registration appointment, and have your approved list of courses, you can check your MySam Worksheet to verify if seats are still available as your registration date approaches.

HOW TO PREPARE:

- After reviewing your worksheet, you should click on the “Plans” tab to review the plan your advisor has created for you.
- Remember, the plan is a starting point; some courses can be re-arranged, depending on your interests and degree requirements.
