

# Indiana State University Intercollegiate Athletics

## 2000-2001 Academic Highlights

Spring 2001, **61%** (190/310) of student-athletes on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll (3.0+ semester GPA), *an all-time high*. (See chart.)

As a whole, student-athletes have a mean cumulative GPA of **3.09** after the spring semester.

**59%** (183/310) of all student-athletes have a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA, *equaling an all-time high*.

After Spring 2001, **80%** of all female student-athletes had a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA, *a new high mark*.

The percentage of student-athletes in poor academic standing is **3%** (9/310) after Spring 2001, down from 5% last fall and 4% last spring.

**Women's Soccer** had **100%** (17/17) of team members above the 3.0 mark in Spring 2001, highest among all ISU athletic teams. **Women's Cross Country** followed with **93%** (13/14).

**Volleyball** registered a team cumulative GPA of **3.68** after the Spring 2001 semester, highest among all ISU Athletic teams.

Showing substantial improvement in team cumulative GPA from the fall were **Men's Basketball**, jumping from 3.09 to **3.22**, and **Men's Cross Country**, from 2.93 to **3.06**.

Improving in percentage of team members on the honor roll in Spring 2001 was **Women's Track & Field** with **74%** (31/42), up from 65% last term.

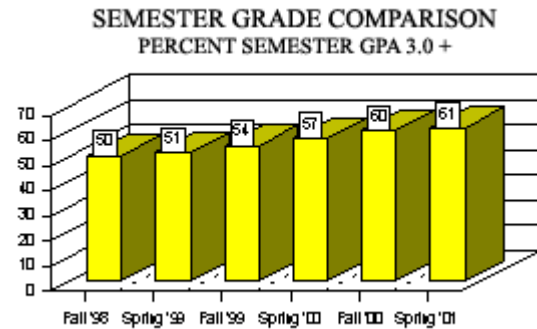
**Tony Albrinck** and **Chris Sapp**, Football, were named to the 2000 Gateway Academic All-Conference First Team.

For Volleyball, **Megan Mirs** received a selection to the 2000 MVC Volleyball Scholar-Athlete First Team. Mirs was also named to the Verizon All-Academic Team for District Five.

**Isaiah Stafford**, Men's Cross Country, was named to the 2000 MVC Scholar-Athlete Team.

For the first season of Women's Soccer at ISU, **Andrea Durham** was selected to the 2000 MVC Scholar-Athlete First Team.

For the third year in a row, Men's Basketball had three of the five representatives on the MVC Scholar-Athlete First Team: **Kelyn Block**, **Michael Menser**, and **Matt Renn**. Renn also earned national honors as a Verizon Second Team Academic All American.



Five Baseball players earned MVC Scholar-Athlete Honors: Named to the First Team were **Jason Frome, Thomas Jeffers, Mitchel Stetter,** and **Chad Zaucha,** making Honorable Mention was **Patrick Tingley.**

For Women's Tennis, **Karen Human,** made the MVC Scholar-Athlete First Team, and **Jennifer Earl** made Honorable Mention.

**Jonas Piibor, Stefan Hirn, Dalibor Mihajlovic,** and **Vedran Vidovic,** Men's Tennis, were named to the MVC Scholar-Athlete First Team, **Loure Brajkovic** made Honorable Mention.

**Women's Track & Field** earned the **second highest team GPA in the nation** with a 3.33 as determined by the Indoor Track Coaches Association, while individually, **Beth Hilton** received All-Academic Honors.

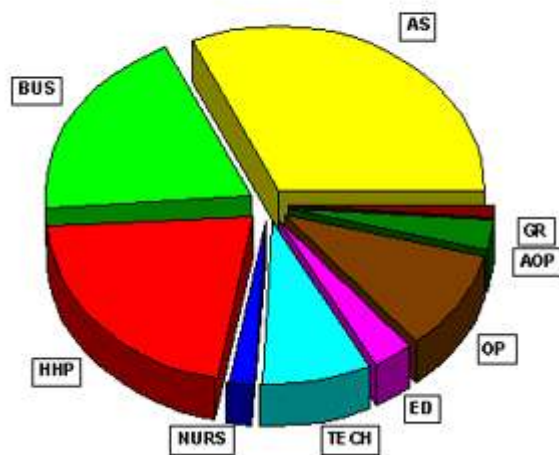
**Aubrey Herring,** Men's Track & Field, was recognized nationally as the only Male, Division I indoor champion to be honored on the All-Academic Team.

**Women's Cross Country** was ranked fourth nationally as an Academic All American Team at the NCAA Division I level.

An average of **67** student-athletes used the Student Academic Services Center for study/tutoring during Spring 2001. This accounted for **4,316** of the Center's study hall/tutoring hours, which was approximately **4.6** hours per week per student-athlete.
