The Department of Psychology at Indiana State University invites applications for a tenure-track appointment at the rank of assistant or associate professor to begin Fall 2025. The position will primarily support our APA accredited clinical psychology doctoral (Psy.D.) program and will also include some undergraduate teaching. The position is open to clinical or counseling psychologists who are eligible for licensure and endorsement as a Health Service Provider in Psychology (HSPP) in Indiana. Candidates with interest and experience in clinical training/supervision are especially encouraged to apply. Additionally, we welcome applications from those who will contribute to diversity-focused training in our clinical psychology doctoral program. Individuals who may have had non-traditional career paths, who have taken time off from their careers, or who have achieved excellence in careers outside of academia are also encouraged to apply.

Responsibilities

- Teach courses at the undergraduate and graduate level. The typical teaching load is 3 classes per semester
- Supervision of empirical Psy.D. dissertations
- Provide supervision for graduate students providing therapy and assessment service at our in-house training clinic
- Maintain a program of research that involves students (graduate or undergraduate)
- Contribute to service activities in the department and university

Required Qualifications

- Ph.D. or PsyD. in counseling or clinical psychology. ABD candidates will be considered but the degree should be awarded prior to the time the position begins.
- Licensed or license-eligible and endorsement as Health Service Provider in Psychology (HSPP) in Indiana.
- History or promise of teaching excellence

Preferred Qualifications

- Interest and experience in clinical training/supervision
- Ability to contribute to diversity-focused training in our clinical psychology doctoral program

Description of University and Community

Indiana State is a comprehensive university with an enrollment of approximately 8,000 students located in West Central Indiana, an area that enables a high quality of life with a low cost of living. ISU has been recognized by the Princeton Review as among the best universities in the Midwest and diversity in our student body is comparable to larger universities in Indiana.

Description of the Department

We have a very collegial department that includes 11 full-time faculty members who support an undergraduate, general masters, and doctoral program (PsyD) in Psychology. Faculty have the opportunity to teach summer courses (mostly online) for supplemental income. In addition, clinical faculty are encouraged to participate in our Faculty Practice Plan, which allows faculty to engage in clinical services through our on-site training clinic. Description of the Psy.D. Program

Our program is a small (6-8 students/year) APA-accredited, university-based Psy.D. program that provides a strong foundation in the scientific bases of psychology as well as broad generalist training in assessment and intervention. Students get robust training in research methods and statistics and are required to complete a dissertation based on an empirical study and also to contribute to the science of clinical psychology through publication and/or presentation of their research.
