Transfer credit will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Up to nine credit hours may be transferred for graduate credit in nonclinical core courses. To be eligible for transfer credit, the course must be judged to be comparable to a required ISU course and should have been taken within 3 years. The student should have earned a grade of A- or higher in the course and will be required to demonstrate the requisite skills associated with the course.
