3. New Business

- a. Curriculum and Instruction Ph.D Proposal (S. Kiger)
 - S. Kiger presented information about the Curriculum and Instruction Ph. D. proposal. As noted, the doctor of philosophy degree in curriculum and instruction is designed to prepare students for positions of educational leadership and research in public schools, colleges and universities, and governmental agencies. Adding a concentration in athletic training will provide professionals holding advanced degrees in athetic training the opportunity to further develop skills needed for teaching and researching educational practices in the field. After some discussion, M. Howard-Hamilton moved to accept and R. Hinshaw seconded. No further discussion occurred. The motion passed (6-0-0).
- Guidance and Psychological Services: Specialization Counselor Education Proposal (A. Viviani)
 - A. Viviani presented information about the Guidance and Psychological Services: Specialization Counselor Education Proposal. As noted, The PhD in Counselor Education prepares persons for positions of leadership in research, teaching, and counseling in collegiate institutions, and leadership positions in student services in public schools. The proposal supports recent policy changes and accreditation requirements. Currently, there are no Counselor Educator Ph.D. programs in Indiana, so ISU would be the first. After some discussion, C. Ball moved to accept and D. Quatroche seconded. No further discussion occurred. The motion passed (6-0-0).
