1. Call to Order at 3:31 p.m.

3. Old Business – BCP 1 and the Maintenance of a 2.5 GPA
It would be helpful to have a report of student GPA at the end of each semester so the advisor would know. It would be possible for ESS to revoke BCP-I status at the end of the semester. It would notify the Dean's office that the student no longer meets the pre-requisites and would initiate an existing process to remove them unless the department approves them to stay enrolled.

Proposed New Policy Language: "Students whose cumulative GPA drops below 2.50 at the end of the semester will have their BCP-I status removed by ESS, causing them to no longer qualify for any course that has BCP-I as a pre-requisite. The Dean's office will notify department chairpersons that those students will be removed from BCP-I courses unless the department grants an exception."

5. TEC Chair Report – Dan Clark; No Report
6. Dean's Report – Brad Balch; This is the week in the state legislature that bills need to move out of committee. There is \$1.2 billion proposed for K-12 education funding in the Governor's State of the Union Address, but it was for education broadly defined and not necessarily public education (e.g., may include support for tax credits, vouchers, charters, etc.) . There is somewhat more emphasis on retaining teachers in local districts through pay increases rather than incentives that attract new high school graduates pursuing teacher education. Dual credit continues to gain traction; the new IDOE "dashboard" includes a focus on college and career readiness, with an emphasis on stackable credentials that students earn in high school. Colleges and universities will be expected to identify

non-course-based options to give credit for those credentials and the IDOE is calling this *College Currency*, which has implications for 2- and 4-year institutions (i.e., How will we recognize non-course credit towards a degree?).
