Called to Order, 3:34 p.m.

1. Approval of Minutes for September 18, 2018; D. Quatroche moved/J. Brosmer seconded. Vote 9-0-2
2. Old Business
 - a. Brown Bag Topics and Dates
 - a. C. Phelps to distribute fliers to TEC members for “Early Childhood Assessment: What’s the Latest Buzz?” – scheduled November 14th from 2:00 – 3:00 p.m.
 - b. M. Crosby – CAEP to focus on the site visit, estimated delivery in March, 2019
 - c. C. Phelps recommended survey of students to complete needs assessment to narrow down potential brown bag topics. Executive committee will discuss the feasibility of conducting this assessment.
3. New Business
 - a. “Adopting” a Code of Ethics (Malea Crosby) Links= NEA <http://www.nea.org/home/30442.htm> and Association of American Educators <https://www.aateachers.org/index.php/about-us/aae-code-of-ethics> - what ethical standards will a teacher be held to if called in front of the licensing board? Sample codes from National Education Association (NEA) and Association of American Educators (AAE) offered for consideration of adoption (these are recommended because they are referenced on IDEO’s website). C. Phelps recommended some sort of assessment; J. Buckenmeyer confirmed that Georgia does an assessment, but Indiana does not nor do they endorse a specific ethical code for educators. The group considered how it would be perceived if we adopted a union code of ethics (i.e., NEA). E. Hampton comment that CAEP requires use to document that graduates demonstrate competencies in ethics.
 - a. Motion to adopt AAE code of ethics as a common framework for all teacher education; A. French moved/C. Phelps seconded. Vote 10-0-1
 - b. Proposals: English Teaching Major (Rob Perrin) – wanting to approve ENG 329 as substitute for ENG 336, D. Quatroche moved/L. Calvin seconded. Vote 11-0-0

4. Dean's Report – Janet Buckenmeyer – wants all program directors to meet to revive/revise programs as needed. TEC is not an appropriate platform for hammering out details - wanting a subcommittee or other body (i.e., TEAC – Teacher Education Advisory Council) to identify pertinent changes. J. Buckenmeyer to discuss with D. Ballard to identify times that this group could meet.
5. Associate Dean's Report – Linda Sperry – TK20 fee structure to be forwarded to program directors.
6. Assistant Dean's Report – Judy Sheese – a question of if TEC wants to further explore eligibility for BCP 1 (requirement of 2.5 GPA) and how that's being tracked. J. Sheese and D. Ballard to discuss. J. Sheese asked for further volunteers to discuss – L. Sperry volunteered. Since so many members were absent from this meeting, J. Sheese will email members to request their involvement.
7. Assessment Director's Report-Malea Crosby – no further information to report apart from the above item under new business.
