## MINUTES

  - d. Topics for Future Discussion in TEC
    - In-depth discussion of licensing and testing issues—contributed by Dan Clark
    - Student teachers cannot be left alone in the classroom; we'd like to require all student teachers to get a substitute teacher's license; it costs \$36 and the student teachers would be paid as subs when they are left alone—contributed by Judy Sheese
    - TEACH program (Diana Wallace) will provide tuition dollars for ECEC teachers to get a master's degree (up to 90% of tuition cost)—contributed by Georgianna Duarte
    - There are new CAEP requirements and information needed for reporting will be shared at the next meeting—contributed by Malea Crosby
5. Dean's Report--New initiatives are being pursued to raise enrollment in the BCOE:
  - A school corporation has reached out to us to provide on-site education for two full cohorts of M.Ed. in Building Administration and Ed.S. in District Administration
  - Transition to Teaching programs are being developed in secondary education, elementary education, and special education
  - A Paraprofessional to SPED licensure program is being developed

- Vigo County School Corporation is pursuing an Education Pathway proposal with the BCOE that will likely yield dozens of new students in our undergraduate teacher education program; one special feature of the proposal is to provide 6 hours of capstone credit for high school seniors that will contribute to a minor (filled by courses already in the T Ed program), so students who transition out of the program to ISU will receive a Minor (yet to be named) which should provide them time within their four-year curriculum to get 18 credit hours in a content area to be licensed as a dual-credit high school teacher

6. Associate Dean's Report—no report

7. Assistant Dean's Report—only 10-12 students have taken the new PRAXIS tests for licensure to this point; several did not pass but only by a few points, which is an improvement over the Pearson licensing tests

8. Assessment Director's Report—we need a consistent remediation plan; CIMT 400 will be on the agenda in October
