



The Indiana State University Athletic Training Programs and the Neuromechanics, Interventions, and Continuing Education Research (NICER) Lab is seeking highly qualified applicants for a newly funded doctoral (PhD) assistant position. The primary duties of this position include teaching within the Athletic Training programs and conducting research as part of the NICER Lab. There may be additional opportunities to mentor graduate (Professional MS in Athletic Training and Post-Professional Doctorate in Athletic Training) research projects in collaboration with faculty. Our philosophy in training and mentoring future faculty members includes a team approach to developing a scholar, teacher, and contributing citizen of the profession of Athletic Training. With this philosophy in mind, the emphasis on development as a teacher will be achieved through a degree program in Curriculum and Instruction with a Concentration in Athletic Training Education. Scholarship areas will align with faculty strengths. This particular candidate will work one-on-one with Dr. Kenneth Games in the research area of neuromechanics, interventions, and the tactical athlete. Professional engagement will occur through active mentorship and support for involvement in the organizations of Athletic Training.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities:

- Teaching up to 6 credits of coursework per semester (during fall and spring)
- Providing administrative support for the Athletic Training programs
- Conducting guided research with Dr. Kenneth Games which may include:
 - Independent and collaborative research
 - Dissemination of research findings through manuscripts and presentations
 - Preparation of grant proposals and IRB applications
 - Manuscript reviews
- Other duties as needed, assigned by Dr. Kenneth Games

Required Qualifications:

- BOC Certified Athletic Trainer
- Eligible for Indiana Athletic Training Licensure
- Graduation from a CAATE-accredited professional level Athletic Training program (BS or MS)

Preferred Qualifications:

- A post-professional degree in Athletic Training or related field
- 1-2 years of clinical practice experience as an Athletic Trainer

Compensation and Benefits:

- In-State tuition waiver (9 credits per semester fall and spring)
- Annual stipend of \$12,500 per academic year (mid-August to early-May)
- Annual NATA Membership Dues
- Biennial Indiana Athletic Training Licensure Fees
