Policy Regarding the Repeat of a Failed Clinical Nursing Course

- Any student repeating a clinical nursing course must repeat both the theoretical and clinical components of the course regardless of whether performance in either one or both components was deficient.
- The instructor has the responsibility to structure the clinical component (number of clinical contact hours and type of experience) in such a way as to facilitate achievement of the student's individual learning needs (based on past performance) and to assure that the course and program outcomes are satisfied.
- A contract will be developed by the instructor in collaboration with the student repeating the course.
  - It will specify the nature of the clinical experiences and/or other conditions that must be satisfied to successfully complete the course.
  - It must be signed by the student and instructor prior to the first clinical experience. A copy will be retained by each party. The instructor copy will be attached to the student's clinical performance evaluation that becomes a part of the student's permanent record in the College at the conclusion of the semester in which the course is taken.
