Undergraduate LPN-BSN Track

Minimum Requirements for [Admission into the University](#) for the LPN to BSN Premajor  
(There may be additional [pre-admission courses](#) for  
admission to the LPN-BSN Track of the Baccalaureate Nursing Program)

Eligibility requirements include, but are not limited to:

- 1) Completion of a minimum of three of the following five courses with a grade of “C” or better and
- 2) A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.50 in these courses.
  - 3 credit hour anatomy course including laboratory component
  - 3 credit hour physiology course including laboratory component
  - 4 credit hour chemistry course including laboratory component
  - 3 credit hour microbiology including laboratory component
  - 3 credit hour introduction to psychology course

Please note:

- More than two grades of less than “C” in any of the above five courses, and/or other support courses, in the last five years result in ineligibility.
- A grade of less than “C” twice in one of the above courses or support courses in the last five years results in ineligibility.
- Two grades of less than “C” in any nursing course in an RN program in the last five years result in ineligibility.

Meeting minimum standards for admission to Indiana State University does not guarantee admission to the LPN-BSN track. Admission into the LPN to BSN major is competitive. Admission to Indiana State University and the LPN to BSN pre-major does not guarantee admission into the major of the LPN to BSN track.
