

## **Meet the Presenter**



Bridget Roberts-Pittman, Ph.D., HSPP, LMFT is a Professor of Educational and School Psychology at Indiana State University. She earned her Bachelor's degree from Indiana

University in Psychology and her Master's degree from Indiana State University in Marriage and Family Therapy. Her doctoral degree, also from Indiana State University, is in Counseling Psychology. She holds professional licenses in Indiana in psychology, marriage and family therapy, and clinical addiction counseling. For nearly 20 years, she held the designation of an Approved Supervisor through the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. She has served as the Director of Clinical Training for two doctoral programs at Indiana State University: Counseling Psychology and School Psychology.

Her career began in community mental health working with families referred by the Vigo County Juvenile Justice Center. Her role included conducting assessments and providing family therapy on an outpatient basis in school and home settings. Her clinical work further included intensive outpatient services for substance abuse. She completed her predoctoral internship also in a community mental health setting working in inpatient, outpatient, and residential settings with a variety of clinical populations. She has given over 20 national, international, and invited presentations in the area of bullying, fathering, and supervision.
