Dr. Chambers is Associate Professor of Psychiatry and Director of Addiction Psychiatry Fellowship Training at the Indiana University (IU) School of Medicine in Indianapolis. He graduated from Centre College in 1991, Duke University School of Medicine in 1996, and Yale University Department of Psychiatry Residency and Fellowship programs in Psychiatry and Neuroscience Research in 2000 and 2002. He completed his fellowship training in Addiction Psychiatry at IU in 2012. He is an addiction psychiatrist with the Adult Dual Diagnosis Clinic of Midtown Mental Health Center in Indianapolis.

As director of the Laboratory for Translational Neuroscience of Dual Diagnosis and Development at IU, Dr. Chambers' research explores the neural and developmental mechanisms underlying addiction vulnerability in mental illness. His work, spanning animal modeling, neurocomputational, clinical, and health systems research, aims to help build a neuroscientific foundation upon which fully integrated mental health and addiction services and professional training efforts of the future may be built.
