Dr. Christmas serves as a Clinical Provider Trainer for MHS Indiana, presenting on clinical behavioral health topics for primary care and behavioral health providers throughout the state of

Indiana and beyond. He earned a Ph.D. in Counselor Education & Supervision from the University of Central Florida and is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC) in the state of Indiana. Previous to his role as a Clinical Provider Trainer, he served as an adjunct professor for graduate mental health counseling programs at Stetson University and at Palm Beach Atlantic University in Florida. Several years of private practice and clinical supervision add color and context to his training. He was also immersed in an intensive clinical setting for eight years conducting psychotherapy, trauma-focused, and psychoeducational groups in addition to individual, couples, and family therapy at La Amistad Behavioral Treatment Center in Orlando, Florida. It was during that tenure that he earned his Master's Degree in Counseling at Reformed Theological Seminary and got licensed as an LMHC in Florida.
