

Meet the Presenters



Dr. Bolinskey received his B.S. from Clinch Valley College in 1997. He obtained his M.A. in psychology from the University of Virginia in 2000, and his Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Virginia in 2002, where he studied pre-morbid indicators of schizophrenia under Irving I. Gottesman. His pre-doctoral internship was

completed at Eastern Virginia Medical School. After receiving his Ph.D., Dr. Bolinskey completed a two-year, NIMH-funded post-doctoral fellowship at the Virginia Institute for Psychiatric and Behavioral Genetics, Medical College of Virginia/Virginia Commonwealth University. Dr. Bolinskey's primary research interests are in the areas of premorbid indicators of schizophrenia and personality assessment. His primary clinical interests are in the areas of severe psychopathology and assessment. He has published multiple articles on schizotypy and personality assessment and is a co-author of Psychological Assessment with MMPI-2/MMPI-2-RF, 3rd Ed.

Paul Lysaker is a professor of clinical psychology in the department of Psychiatry at the Indiana University School of Medicine. He is a published author of over 370 peer reviewed articles and has been a recipient of continuous federal funding since 2001.



He has published on monograph with Oxford University press and two edited volumes with Routledge and Elsevier Press. He has been involved in the practice, supervision and study of individual psychotherapy for adults with psychotic disorders since the early 1990s.

Participants will:

Presentation 1

- Understand core constructs of diagnoses of schizophrenia and schizoaffective disorders
- Understand first-rank symptoms and how over-reliance on them can lead to over diagnosis of schizophrenia and schizoaffective disorder
- Understand the importance of episode duration and its relativity to duration of psychosis symptoms when making diagnostic decisions
- Combine this knowledge to effectively differentiate between schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, and mood disorders with psychotic features.

Presentation 2

- Participants will be able to describe how forms of metacognitive deficit are significant barriers to recovery from severe mental illnesses such as schizophrenia
- Participants will be able to name 5 basic beliefs which are foundational for an integrative psychotherapy can offer to enhance metacognitive capacity among adults with psychotic disorders
