Session 1 - Military Family Considerations and Clinical Practice

JUNE WATTS—June Behn Watts is a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist and has been working with the Indianapolis Vet Center since 2010. She provides Readjustment Counseling to combat veterans and their families to include individual counseling, couples counseling, bereavement counseling, and counseling to survivors of Military Sexual Trauma. She has provided several presentations on veterans and their families at the state and national levels. She has a Master of Science from Purdue University Northwest specializing in Marriage and Family Therapy. June is a Clinical Fellow in the Association for Marriage and Family Therapy and a Board Member for the Indiana Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. June is a veteran of the Indiana Army National Guard and served a tour in Afghanistan with the 76th Infantry Brigade from 2004-2005 as a Mental Health Specialist.

Session 3 - Substance Abuse Treatment for Veterans and Their Families: Successes and Challenges

MATT FRYMIRE- Matt Frymire is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker at the Roudebush VA Medical Center in Indianapolis. Matt first began working in the mental health field in 2004 after previously working for several years in city and state government. He started specializing in addiction treatment in 2008 and currently works at the Indianapolis VA on the substance use disorders and recovery team. Matt's primary focus is on the successful treatment of opioid addiction and the use of opiate replacement therapy to help veterans achieve a better quality of life.

Session 4 - Suicide Prevention and Serving the Veteran Population

TRAVIS FIELD—Travis Field is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker at the Roudebush VA Medical Center. Travis started his career in mental health in 1997, to include serving adults with serious mental illness in 3 different Community Mental Health Centers, prior to earning his Master of Social Work degree from the Indiana University School of Social Work in 2005. Travis started working as a Social Worker at the Indianapolis VA in 2005, and is currently the Lead Suicide Prevention Coordinator and Supervisory Social Worker for the Suicide Prevention Program, Emergency Department Social Work Team, Mental Health Enrollment/Continuity of Care Social Work Team, and Inpatient Psychiatry Social Work Team.
