Dear Dr. Bradley:

The Board of Directors of the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) met January 9-11, 2015, for the purpose of rendering accreditation decisions. At this meeting, the Board reviewed an Interim Report submitted by the Bayh College of Education at Indiana State University. This report was required to more fully address the specific standards cited in the accreditation decision letter that was sent to your office and dated January 14, 2013. The report specifically addressed standards relative to the accreditation of the Clinical Mental Health Counseling (M.S. degree) and School Counseling (M.Ed. degree) programs at your institution.


Based on their review of the report and supporting documentation, the Board decided to extend the accredited status of these programs for an additional two years through March 31, 2017. Although the majority of the conditions outlined in the original accreditation decision letter have been addressed, the Board determined that a condition remains and requires additional documentation. This condition is outlined on page 3 of this letter.

To address the remaining standard, a second Interim Report should be submitted to the CACREP office no later than October 1, 2016. This deadline allows for the CACREP Board's review of the report and supporting documentation at its January 2017 meeting. Four copies of the report in read-only format on CDs should be submitted. Upon a favorable review by the Board, these programs would then be permitted to continue their accredited status through the remainder of the accreditation cycle ending October 31, 2020. Please note that the expiration date reflects a short term extension granted to the program in its last cycle. In addition, please be advised that since this will be the program's second Interim Report, if the conditions are not adequately

addressed, as per CACREP policy, the Board will have no choice but to deny continued accreditation at that time.

A revised certificate of accreditation will be enclosed with Dr. Hill-Clarke's copy of this letter. Once again, the Board extends its thanks to you and your administration for the support given to the faculty in maintaining the accredited status of these programs. Such support is considered vital to assuring continued quality in higher education programs.
