

Reopening Plan Framework

- Beginning July 6, 2020, the Student Recreation Center and Campus Recreation programming will be determined based on available staffing.
- Employees must wear face covering when physical distancing cannot be reasonable maintained (at least 6 feet between people/equipment).
- Members are expected to wear face covering when social distancing cannot be maintained (at least 6 feet between people/equipment).
- Class sizes must be spaced to accommodate physical distancing (at least 6 feet between people/equipment).
- Outdoor exercise classes may be an option or moving classes to accommodate more open spaces in the facility.
- Continue to create and offer virtual options.
- Equipment must be spaced to accommodate physical distancing. Facility layouts may be modified, use of equipment may be limited, and additional rooms/locations may be used to space equipment appropriately where possible.
- Participants will be responsible for cleaning and disinfecting equipment before and after each use.
- Occupancy limits will be established on a continuous basis according to University, local, state, and Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines.
- Communal equipment check-out will be limited to equipment that can be cleaned/sanitized efficiently and effectively.
 - Members are encouraged to bring their own equipment such as basketballs, racquets, etc.
- Locker rooms and lockers will be available in Phase II of the re-opening plan.
- Members are encouraged to bring their own water bottles. Water fountains will be closed until further notice, however, members can utilize the water filter stations in the Student Recreation Center.
- Guest passes will not be available until further notice.
- Normal cleaning and disinfecting schedules will be maintained with heightened cleaning schedules for high-touch public equipment/areas.
- Signage regarding face masks, hygiene, and physical distancing will be posted and promoted.
- Appropriate signage will be posted at entrances and within buildings indicating pathways and positions for standing, waiting, etc., where applicable.
- Physical barriers, such as sneeze guards and partitions, will be placed at high-traffic points-of-sale, service, reception, or other locations where frequent face-to-face interaction occurs.

- Facilities may be closed at various times of the day to increase environmental cleaning and disinfection.
- The Office of Campus Recreation will remain open Monday-Friday during normal university hours. Members are encouraged to conduct business via zoom, phone or via email when possible. If business must be done in the office suite, masks are expected and members should not conduct meetings in individual offices.
