

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Grant Information Spring 2021

Indiana State University will begin distributing \$4.3 million in Federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) grants to eligible students on Monday, March 15, 2021.

The grants, which will be sent to 7,329 ISU students, are for the sole purpose of providing assistance for educational expenses or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus. These grants go directly to students and are not applied to university account balances.

Eligible students will receive \$200 - \$800 based on enrolled hours in a degree seeking program and financial need as determined by the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

Students ineligible to receive the grants include those who are: not enrolled in a degree program; do not have a FAFSA on file; are non-citizens; or withdrew from the university.

The initial funding allocations represent 91 percent of the money required to be distributed to students. The remaining funds will be provided to students who need additional support while enrolled during the summer 2021 or fall 2021, via an application process and until funds are depleted. The application will be available this summer.
