ISU will not require masks for fully vaccinated people after new guidance from CDC

Following [new guidance](#) announced Thursday by the Centers for Disease Control, Indiana State University has ended the requirement for masks to be worn on campus in common areas for people *fully vaccinated*.

Those who are not fully vaccinated against COVID-19 must continue wearing masks.

The CDC says that, in general, people are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after their second dose in a two-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson.

The CDC said fully vaccinated people can, in most cases, “resume activities without wearing a mask or staying 6 feet apart.”

Fully vaccinated people should still wear a mask on buses and other forms of public transportation, the CDC said, as well as in healthcare settings such as a hospital or doctor’s office.

People experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 should get tested, stay home and stay away from others, the CDC said.

ISU strongly encourages everyone to get vaccinated.
