

**Student Faculty Research Award-** This award is designed to benefit both the faculty member and the students' collaborative research efforts through the awarding of Research Assistantship.

**Midwestern Association of Graduate Schools (MAGS) Excellence in Teaching Award-**This award is in recognition of graduate students who exemplify excellence in the teaching/learning mission of our universities. Two awards have been created to recognize the importance of excellence in teaching and mentoring as a component of graduate education and the preparation of graduate students for future service as college and university faculty. One award will be given to a doctoral student and one to a master's student.

**Distinguished Student Assistant Awards-** This award is designed to honor the students who support the work of the university through their employment with academic departments, administrative offices and off campus community service agencies.

## Scholarships

**Illinois Student Scholarship-**Candidates must be residents of Illinois and have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. All incoming graduate students, effective Fall 2009, who are admitted to the University will be automatically considered for this scholarship.\*

**Kentucky Student Scholarship-**Candidates must be residents of Kentucky and have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. All incoming graduate students, effective Fall 2012, who are admitted to the University will be automatically considered for this scholarship.\*

**Midwest Consortium Scholarship-** Candidates must be residents of Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, or Wisconsin and have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. All incoming graduate students, effective Fall 2009, who are admitted to the University will be automatically considered for this scholarship.\*

**Ohio Student Scholarship-**Candidates must be residents of Ohio and have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. All incoming graduate students, effective Fall 2012, who are admitted to the University will be automatically considered for this scholarship.\*

\*Students pursuing Nursing programs are not eligible.

\*Students pursuing doctoral degrees are not eligible.

\*Students pursuing M.S. degree in Occupational Therapy and Physician Assistant Studies are not eligible.

**Arab Student Aid International Scholarship-**Candidates must be an Arab student with a visa in 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> year of studies at ISU and have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Candidates must be nominated by a ISU faculty member.

**Lois Burdick Scholarship-**Candidates must be nominated by ISU faculty member. The graduate student must be enrolled in Teacher Education.

**Paul Witty Scholarship**-Candidates must show evidence of a professional commitment to the psychology of reading and/or the education of gifted and creative children. A minimum graduate GPA of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale on all completed courses and must hold regular admission to a graduate program.

## Scott College of Business

**Wilson M. House Memorial MBA Scholarship**-Student in the Master of Business Administration program who graduated from a high school in Indiana or a surrounding state.

**Sue House Salmon Memorial Scholarship**-Graduate student in the College of Business who has demonstrated academic achievement and has graduated from a high school located in Indiana or a surrounding state (including Illinois, Michigan, Kentucky, and Ohio).

**William G. Riley Endowed Scholarship**-First consideration will be to a member of Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity. College of Business undergraduate junior or senior or graduate MBA student who holds a minimum of 3.0 GPA.

## College of Education

**World Travel Scholarship**-The applicant is a graduate student at Indiana State University that must be in good academic standing, and must complete the travel experience either while an ISU student or within three months of graduation. Preference shall be given to those who have not yet traveled abroad; a student may only receive the award once.

**Ann & Vance England Scholarship**-Student must be a female who is pursuing a graduate degree in Educational Leadership and maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Preference will be given to an applicant from Wayne County, Indiana. If no such applicant is available, preference will be given to applicant that has graduated from a high school located in the state of Indiana.

**Anne Lee Scholarship**-A graduate student with Dietetics major. Must have evidence of good scholarship and be recommended by faculty member.

**August S. Wehmeyer Trust Scholarship**-Any student enrolled at ISU.

**Becker-School Psychology Scholarship**-A Doctoral student in the Department of Education Psychology and School Psychology.

**Benjamin Moulton Geography Scholarship**-Two awards shall be considered annually. An award to a doctoral student based on evidence of potential research skills. An award to a master's student based on evidence of scholarship. Students eligible for either award must have at least one year in residence at the time the award is granted.

**Charles Nicol Graduate Scholarship**-Entering graduate student in English with best credentials.

**Charles Roll History Award**-An award to outstanding graduate student in History.

**Concerto/Aria Competition Scholarship**-Scholarship is awarded to the winner(s) of the annual Concerto/Aria Competition. Participants must be a graduate music major or minor, a full-time student and performance study at both the time of the concert and performance.

**David Perrin Scholarship**-Consideration for use of the fund shall be as directed based on the following  
1. Recipient must be an athletic training graduate at ISU. 2. First consideration will be given to recruiting graduate students who will enhance the diversity of the athletic training profession.

**Dr. Akhtar H. Siddiqi Memorial Scholarship**-Recipient must be enrolled full time in the graduate program with a declared major in geography, 2.Must be Muslim with first preference given to Pakistani Muslims(s).

**Dr. Bonnidell Clouse Scholarship**-1.Recipient(s) must be enrolled in a graduate program in the ISU College of Education or have completed graduate degree requirements or have been awarded a graduate degree within the award year 2.Award is to be given for research that emphasizes the application of a psychological and/or educational theory to a problem in the classroom or an educational environment 3. Preference given to (although not limited to) areas related to moral education, character education or values education 4. Award will be given for research for a published manuscript (one accepted for publication), a theses, specialist project, or dissertation, or a presentation at a refereed conference.

**Dr. Dale Findley Professional Development Award**-1.Recipient must be from the Department of Educational Leadership, Administration, and Foundations as master's, specialist degree level, doctoral, or non degree certification student 2.Recipient must indicate how state, national, or International travel would enhance their professional development in educational administration.

**Dr. Jing Chen Memorial Scholarship**-1.Recipient(s) must be enrolled full time as a graduate student in the Biology Department at ISU 2.Recipient(s) must maintain a minimum of 3.0 grade point average of a 4.0 scale 3.Preference will be given to applicants who are international students from China 4.Preference will be given to students who are Biology majors.

**Dr. Leah B. Ramer Scholarship**-1.Recipient should be a graduate student who is a Sigma Theta Tau member 2.Recipient should demonstrate leadership potential with a strong commitment to the field of nursing 3.Scholarship and leadership should weigh much heavier in the selection than financial need.

**Dr. Marvin Henry Legacy Scholarship**-Consideration for this scholarship shall be given to an ISU graduate student with the preference given to those with secondary grade certificates, who meets the following criteria:1.Enrolled and in good standing with the Bayh College of Education graduate program 2.Have shown leadership possibilities in teacher education, preferably in the area of field experiences and the potential to expand the profession 3.Leadership would be demonstrated in one or more of the following professional criteria:1.A proposal for presentation by a national organization for its program 2.Develop a proposed program designed to improve supervision or professional involvement 3.Writing

which shows “cutting edge” thought published in a refereed journal 4. Participation in professional leadership as a participant in governance of a professional organization 5. Recognition as an excellent teacher as evaluated by criteria used to evaluate teachers.

**Edgar L. Morphet Research Scholarship**-Student interested in being considered for this award should be graduate students enrolled in an education administration program through the Bayh College of Education. Students are to complete this application and must include the following: a research proposal consisting of a title, contextual introduction, statement of the problem/need for the study, purpose of the study, procedures to be used to conduct the study, and a proposed time-table for the completion of the research. Students will also be required to submit a resume.

**Edward C. Roeber Memorial Scholarship**-Scholarship to be awarded to a Graduate Student in the field of counseling.

**Endowment for Excellence**-This scholarship is awarded to provide assistance for graduate research.

**Fort Harrison Chapter of the D.A.R. Scholarship**-Graduate or undergraduate who has demonstrated knowledge and interest in United States history or related area.

**Fred Swalls Award in Educational Administration**-Applicant must be admitted to the PhD program in the school administration and must submit a letter requesting the scholarship to the Department of Educational Leadership; selection committee 2. Recipient must receive the endorsement of the majority of the educational faculty on duty 3. Applicants will be evaluated on scholarship, personal attributes and leadership potential.

**Jessie N. House Memorial Scholarship**-Applicant must be a full-time graduate student who has demonstrated academic achievement and has graduated from a high school located in Indiana or surrounding state (IL, KY, MI, or OH).

**Jim and Judy Poisel Grad Student Scholarship**-The scholarship shall be awarded to a worthy graduate student currently pursuing a Master’s Degree at ISU and who has demonstrated interest in working with college students. First preference will be a student enrolled in the College of Education and if there are no eligible students, then a student enrolled in the College of Business.

**Leland D. “Bill” Melvin Memorial Fund**-Must be a full-time graduate student(s) enrolled in educational administration program of the College of Education. 1. Awards may be used to recognize scholarships, to provide resources to assist student research, or to provide professional conference participation. 2. Applicants must upload a letter to the department chairman in which they provide a brief overview of their educational background and a brief discussion as to how the money would be used if awarded.

**Liam K. Grimley Prof Development**-Graduate students in the School Psychology Program at ISU for national and international travel related to professional development. Recipients of the award should honor the professional interests and values espoused by Dr. Grimley, and these include a commitment

to child and adolescent development, psycho-educational interventions for parents and families, multicultural diversity, and international school psychology.

**Lloyd & Wieke Benjakin Scholarship**-This scholarship is available to any student whether full or part time, graduate or undergraduate, who is using their education as a means of becoming a better member of society. Recipients must be contributing to their total fees with some of their own earnings.

**Lloyd N. and Marguerite H. Smith Graduate Assistantship in Education**-Worthy full time graduate student with a declared major in the College of Education. Must meet grade point average standards for graduate assistantships. First consideration for Early, Elementary and Special Education majors.

**Lois Burdick Scholarship**-Eligible student will be a graduate student enrolled in teacher education at ISU.

**Marian J. Frutiger Memorial Scholarship in Art**-Recipient(s) must be full time undergraduate or graduate students who have declared a major in art. 1. Graduate student must have a minimum 3.5 grade point average 2. Recipients meeting criteria may re-apply.
