Women's basketball player tests positive for COVID-19

Indiana State University Athletics has learned that a women's basketball student-athlete has tested positive for COVID-19. The women's basketball program will pause its on-campus summer workouts while all team members, coaches and support staff are tested for COVID-19 and quarantine for 14 days.

All members of the women's basketball program will be cleared by medical staff before they return to campus, including any ISU Athletics facility.

"The health and well-being of our student-athletes will always be our top priority," said Sherard Clinkscales, Director of Athletics.

ISU has had more than 100 student-athletes on campus since June 20. Until now, none had tested positive.
