STAYING HEALTHY IN COLLEGE

- You're going to be learning a lot during the upcoming semester. Getting 7-8 hours of sleep is one way that you can make studying and remembering a lot easier.
- Feeling drained or homesick? Mental health is important when starting college and ISU is here to help! You can visit the Student Counseling Center on the 2nd floor of Gillum Hall for a walk-in visit or call **812-237-3939** to make an appointment.

HOW TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN CLASS

- We know going to class can be hard, especially if it's at 8:00 a.m. But this is a great time for you to ask questions, or hear the professor's answer to your classmates' questions. You might even find out if today's topic will be on the exam or not.
- Looking forward to not having class all day? While you may be spending less time in the classroom than high school, most classes will require you to do homework and reading outside of class. Some classes may be have more or less homework, but it's recommended that students spend 2-3 hours studying outside of class for every hour they are in class.
- Want to know how you'll be graded? **Read the syllabus!** Some classes will have a limit on the number of times you can be absent from class before automatically receiving a failing grade. Your syllabus will also have a schedule for upcoming tests and large assignments, be sure to put them on your calendar.



OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Need help outside of class? Professors want you to do well, so they list times that they aren't in class teaching as office hours. These are times for you to stop by and ask questions one-on-one.

If you are struggling in a class, we are here to help!

- If you need help in a class, go to the lower level of Normal Hall for free tutoring services! They will help you find a tutor that has taken the class you need help in.
- There could be a Supplemental Instructor (SI) that will provide help in a class they have already taken and done well in. The SI sit in on the class so they know exactly what you're talking about each day. They will have SI sessions outside of the class time to provide help.
- Math and writing are very important in college. For assistance on assignments, visit the writing center on the second floor of the library. If you're looking for help with a math course, then head to A09 in the basement of Root Hall.

CAMPUS SAFETY

- **ISU Public Safety is available 24/7 for your safety needs.** They have 25 full-time police officers, who in addition to providing escort services or helping you jump your car, also have full police authority to enforce state and federal laws, along with University policies. You can visit them in person between Erickson and Pickerl Hall or call their non-emergency number at **812-237-5555**.
- Go to your MyISU Portal and make sure you are signed up for Rave Alerts. This is how you stay informed about severe weather, crime alerts, and the infamous campus closure.
- If you brought a bike to campus, be sure to stop by Public Safety to have it registered. In the event your bike is stolen, this will assist Public Safety in reclaiming it and contacting you when it is found.

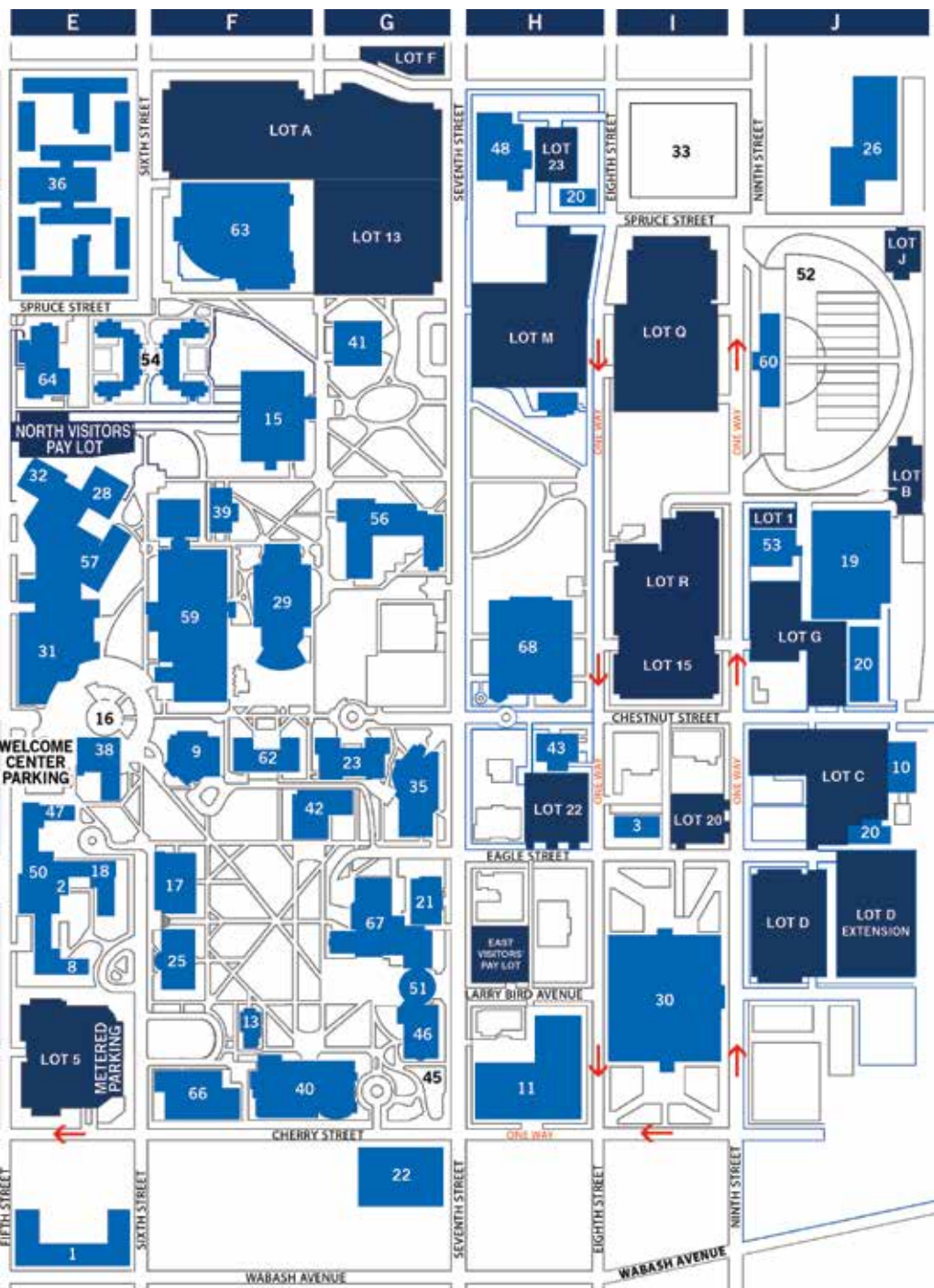
