Completing Assignments

Coursework is an essential part of learning. Even with online courses, you will have to complete and turn in all assignments. Online coursework may include Blackboard assignments, discussion boards, group projects, and video projects.

Blackboard has a mobile app that is compatible with cell phones and other devices. While the app can be useful for students, it is important to note the <u>following limitations</u>:

- Descriptions for content folders, links, etc. will not be displayed.
- Support for videos, images, and other content will depend on the device's operating system.
- Groups, journals, wikis, and Blackboard Collaborate cannot be accessed.
