What does it mean to be a Staff Council Representative?

Staff Council (SC) is the advocacy organization that serves as an ambassador for Staff. Council members are



elected individuals from departments across campus who serve designated terms. SC is organized using bylaws and governed by a member-elected Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee consists of a

Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. There are four appointed positions: Communications Officer, Grievance Liaison, Elections Officer and Parliamentarian. Officers can hold their position no longer than three consecutive years and must have at least a one year break before running for office again.

There are a total of thirty representatives who have voting privileges. Staff who have successfully completed their introductory period of ninety (90) days are eligible to be elected to Staff Council. Representatives are elected for three year terms.

A series of committees assists Staff Council in addressing issues and concerns. These committees are: Public Relations, Staff Benefits, and Staff Relations. Each committee will be given charges annually that they will research and evaluate to determine feasibility and probability of change. Charges that can be approved, will be transformed into a comprehensive proposal that the Council at large will discuss and vote to take to University Administration.

Staff Council Annual Retreat

On July 15, 2021 Staff Council Representatives attended their annual retreat at the Red Barn in Terre Haute. The annual retreat is a way for Staff Council to learn about different areas, initiatives, or upcoming changes at ISU. They hear from guest speakers and do activities that foster collaboration and team building and they create their goals and charges for the upcoming year. Ideas for committee charges are also dicussed at the retreat.

The information we learned will be highlighted in the articles within this edition. Look for our 21-22 goals and charges to be discussed in our next edition where we will start including updates from committees, affinity groups, departments and other organizations across campus.

Capital Projects Update

We are happy to report that Drieser Hall is approximately halfway complete!

Update on current projects:

Lincoln Quad – Excavation is complete. The area contained many foundations that had to be removed to allow the space to be filled and seeded. At this time there are no plans for new construction in this space, it will be greenspace.

✓ Southwest Plaza of the Science Building replacement project is underway.

Small Maintenance Projects – Replacing the roof on the Water Treatment Plant, Utility Tunnel Work, etc. are on schedule.

Facilities will be working to update the Master Plan for construction and projects with the goal of aligning it with ISU's Strategic Plan. It will be presented to the Board of Trustees later this year.

The Indiana General Assembly, the body who allocates funding for capital projects, met in June and did not authorize capital funding for University Projects in this budget. This means that for the next two years no new projects will be authorized. Keep in mind, this does not mean repairs and maintenance items cannot happen. It means that ISU will have to budget for these projects out of other areas.

Parking on Campus



Lot A (7th and Tippecanoe), Lot 5 (5th and Cherry) and the Pavilion Pay Lot (7th and Larry Bird) will be closed for approximately two weeks (July 28) for seal coating.

In August, parking permits will renew for the 21-22 school year. ISU parking lots require permits for usage from 7:00am – 5:00pm Monday through Friday. These lots are available without permits from 5:00pm - 7:00am seven days a week.

ISU requires parking permits for staff, students, and faculty. Permits that can be purchased annually include: Garage, Faculty/Staff, Students, Handicap, Remote, and Motorcycle permits.

Every year Staff Council receives feedback asking for changes to parking permits. During our annual retreat, Staff Council Representatives asked Senior Vice President of Finance, Administration/University Treasurer Diann McKee about parking and what can be done to reduce or remove fees. She explained that the State of Indiana does not provide any funds for parking to any state university. The funds we pay for parking are only used for parking lot needs and services. Seal coating, striping, snow removal, repairs and maintenance costs all must be budgeted through the parking permit fees.

We are happy to report we have had no cases or quarantines at ISU for at least a month!

Earlier this month, ISU rolled out the ISU COVID-19 Vaccination Record App in MYISU Portal. Amy Demchak and Tami-Weinzapfel-Smith along with OIT staff worked with Qualtrics to create a space where COVID-19 Vaccine Records can be stored.

Currently, ISU is not requiring students, staff or faculty to be vaccinated and providing vaccination records is completely optional. Those who chose to upload their vaccination records will not be required to fill out Daily Health Assessments or wear masks. This voluntary submittal will assist ISU and local health departments with contact tracing.

Those who have not been vaccinated will be required to complete the Daily Health Assessment.

The response from staff has been great. "We rolled this out on Friday right before the holiday weekend thinking we would have a few responses to get used to how to process them. We had 244!" says Tami Weinzapfel-Smith, Executive Director of Human Resources. Approximately 678 vaccine records have been received.

Make sure if you are helping someone upload their vaccination records, they are logged into MYISU Portal. If you are logged in, this record will be uploaded to your account.

You will get an email from Qualtrics once your submission has been approved. This is the email you will need to keep or take a photo of to take to the SRC, Sycamore Dining, or ISU Psychology Clinic. If boosters or other updated vaccines are required this process will be addressed and updated as per CDC, State of Indiana, and ISU guidelines at that time.




Need to release some stress? Employees are invited to stop by to pick up a fidget toy, play with sensory dough, try a meditative coloring sheet or get active.



Health Screenings


ISU Health Center Now Scheduling Screenings on-campus

Compensation Corner

Out of Class Pay

During the last year, Staff have been amazing, keeping departments together through adapting and overcoming everything thrown their way. Staff have retired, moved on, or changed positions leaving department staff picking up added responsibilies.

One way to ease the stress of these new responsibilities is to apply for out of class pay. This temporary pay allocation allows staff who have taken on added job responsibilities due to vacant positions within their department to be compensated for that.

Here's what to do:

- Demonstrate work is outside of class.
- Determine how much time this work requires.
- Ask your supervisor to reach out to Tami Weinzapfel-Smith or Margaret Mary Welch.
- Describe the timeframe this work will be needed (i.e.: Hiring new person, adjusting position description, etc.).

Back pay is not typically offered for this option, but it is evaluated case by case.

Changing Jobs on Campus

Changing jobs, pay grades, or job class may also come with changes in compensation, timelines for reaching midpoints, etc. The general idea is that if you move jobs, your time in the job starts over in respect to promotion tiers. However, if you move laterally where you keep the same job title that time does not restart.

For instance, if you change jobs and you move as an Administrative Assistant III in one department to become an Administrative Assistant III in another department, your time does not restart just because you switched departments. If you went from a Custodian I in one department to a Custodian II in another department, then your time would restart.

However, it is also important to understand an employee who receives a promotion to a job in a higher salary range will receive an increase in pay up to 10% of the new range midpoint, or the amount necessary to bring their salary to the minimum rate of the new salary range. An employee who has been moved more than one range may receive an increase of up to 15% of the range midpoint or to the minimum rate of the new salary range whichever is greater.

2020-2021 Accomplishments Distance Fee Waiver

Staff Council submitted a recommendation during 2020 to University Administration to allow a fee waiver for Distance Education Delivery Fees. This recommendation was accepted and will be put in practice starting with the Fall 2021 Semester.

What does this mean?

The \$30 per online course fee is waived for up to 9 credit hours per semester. This is for both graduate and undergraduate course work.

Unemployment Scam

With the reinstatement of the Federal Government's unemployment program brings a new scam. Exec Director Human Resources, Tami Weinzapfel-Smith explained that ISU employees have received text messages stating that their unemployment claims have been approved.

A well-organized crime ring that appears to have access to extensive records of personal identifiable



information taken during previous cyber attacks has been filing fradulent unemployment claims on behalf of unsuspecting victims using their

social security numbers and other personal information. Victims may be contacted via text, email, or phone.

She advised us not to provide any personal information if these calls are received. Do not click on links in text messages or emails. Report these to HR.
