September is National Sickle Cell Awareness Month, a time to bring attention to this genetic blood disease that affects millions of people. Because patients with this disease can experience severe pain and often require blood transfusions. the blood you donate this month helps these patients thrive.

- Sickle cell disease (SCD) affects approximately 100,000 Americans.
- · SCD occurs among 1 out of every 365 people of African descent.
- About 1 in 13 babies of African descent is born with sickle cell trait.
- Blood that closely matches that of a patient is less likely to be rejected by the patient and can mean fewer complications after a transfusion.


Does ISU have your most recent personal information such as emergency contact, home address, and telephone number? A periodic review and update, if needed, of your personal information is a good idea.


LEAP Indiana 4th Monday Coffee Hour: Inclusion Certification Program


Staff Relations Committee
