Hello ISU Staff and welcome to 2022. We wanted to share some updates and helpful information to those who haven't visited the library in some time, perhaps you're a new employee or you just would like a refresher in all things CML.

We want to invite you all to come see Andy Warhol work on display (tell your friends too). It will be available January 10<sup>th –</sup> April 29th. Stop by the Special Collections lobby (Room 319) to see an exhibition of Warhol's photography work. Titled, "Pop Photography: Every Bad Picture is a Good Picture". Warhol used his relationship to photography as a visual diary of his day-to-day life and a medium used to develop print, painting, and design projects throughout his late career.

Looking to check some books or media out but don't know what you need or how much you can get? First and foremost. make sure you have your University ID. You can't check out without it. ISU Staff and Faculty can check out browsing media for 7 days with no renewals. Most other items in the library can

be checked out for 180 Days (basically 6 months) and can be renewed up to three times as long as the item isn't put on hold or recalled by another user.

But CML, how many items can I check out? That's easy, how many can you carry? Because you can check out up to 250 items. Now, I don't recommend it, because if it gets lost, you will have to pay to replace the item. I know you're all avid readers but even I can't keep up with all 2 million volumes of material.

February 1, 2022:



March 1, 2022:


