## How To Register Online

#### ☐Step One

Type **indstate.edu/community-engagement/olli** or **olli at isu** into your browser search bar to go to the OLLI page of the ISU website.

#### ☐Step Two

Click on the words that say **REGISTER FOR OLLI CLASSES & EVENTS BY CLICKING HERE**. This will take you to a new page.

#### ☐ Step Three

If you are already a member, click **LOG ON**, enter your email and password, or choose **Forgot/Don't Know?** to reset. Then skip to Step Five.

If you are not a member, click on the words of one of the OLLI membership options (either Annual or Summer), then click on either **ENROLL YOURSELF** or **ENROLL SOMEONE ELSE**. For returning members who are renewing their membership, there is one option, but if you are new to OLLI, choose the **SIGN UP** option which will take you to a new page that you must fill out in order to set up an account. Once you set up the account, you will land on a new page that will give you the option of saving to the shopping cart and continuing, enrolling someone else, or proceeding to checkout.

#### ☐Step Four

If you chose to save and continue, you will be directed to a page which will require you to make a selection. Read the choices and make a selection.

#### ☐Step Five

You may now click on the link to go to the courses and events.

#### ☐Step Six

The course/event registration process will be much smoother if you use the course guide and registration form to plan ahead prior to getting on the computer, but the website does allow you to read a description of the various program offerings and see when and where they meet. You may click on the button to **ENROLL YOURSELF** or **ENROLL SOMEONE ELSE**, and that course will be added to your shopping cart. You will then be offered the choice to continue shopping or to proceed to checkout. Make a choice.

#### ☐Step Seven

Continue choosing classes until you are ready to checkout. Once you are ready, click on the **PROCEED TO CHECKOUT** button.

Once you arrive on the checkout page, have your credit or debit card ready to submit your payment information as directed and complete your registration.

#### Program Cancellation/Refund

Although highly unlikely, programs are occasionally canceled due to weather or other circumstances beyond the Institute's control. #### The Big Business of College Sports

While many pine for the "good old days" before college sports became big business, the influence of sponsors and advertisers is not new to intercollegiate athletics. In fact, the very first American intercollegiate athletic competition, a boat race between Harvard and Yale in 1852, was sponsored by the Boston, Montreal, and Concord Railroad Company.

Since that time, intercollegiate sports in the United States has grown from a primarily student-led competition for bragging rights to a vast commercial operation. As of 2021, the U.S. Dept. of Education estimated the size of the US college sports industry to be \$14.4 billion. The financial impact of college athletics and the accompanying cultural attachment is uniquely American.

In this two-session course, Dr. Jim Evans, Professor of Sport Management, will discuss the historical evolution of the business of college sports with particular emphasis on recent legal and governance changes that give college athletes greater rights than they have ever had. Session One will cover the evolution of college athletics as a business, and Session Two will highlight recent changes to college sports (NIL/Transfer Portal) that will undoubtedly impact how the game is played, coached, and enjoyed by fans.

ISU Associate Professor of History, Dr. Anne Foster, presents the first installment of a three-part series called *The History of Food*. This first class, *Game Changing Foods*, will examine two foods, sugar and corn, that changed the way people eat. Prior to 1700, sugar was so rare and expensive people took it as medicine. In 2024, sugar is so cheap and common that Americans on

average consume 17 teaspoons per day, more than twice what is recommended. Sugar fueled slavery and the industrial revolution, and it has transformed nearly every food people eat, from marinated chicken to bread to spaghetti sauce. In Indiana, people eat a lot of corn: corn on the cob. cornbread, corn pudding, and of course, corn syrup. Corn is a New World food, not known in Europe, Asia or Africa before 1500. Corn consumption guickly spread around the world, but for animals, not humans. Corn made it possible to raise animals more quickly and cheaply for meat and milk. This course will explore how everyone in the world has come to eat a lot of corn, although outside the United States, they rarely eat it directly.

The first building to be featured in the OLLI at ISU Historic Buildings of the Wabash Valley Series, the ISU Federal Hall, located at the corner of 7th & Cherry on the ISU campus, is the current home of the Scott College of Business. Long before this building was filled with students, however, it was the Terre Haute post office and housed key federal offices-Social Security, Internal Revenue Service, the FBI, and the Federal Court. This grand building, built in the early-1930s as part of the WPA, is a classic example of the art deco style of design that was typical of many federal buildings in the 1930s. The building was placed on the National Registry of Historic Places in 1984. After security changes for all federal buildings, a new federal courthouse was built and Congress transferred the building to the University in 2010. ISU invested \$30 million to renovate the building and retrofit it for educational purposes, with the first classes held in 2012. Join ISU Professor Emeritus Dr. Bruce McLaren and Lisa Gomperts, FAIA, from Schmidt Architects in the stunning Magna Carta Room as they provide a history of the building and its renovation. 
