Mini-Grants Available to Support Career Readiness, Experiential Learning, and Community Engagement

Could you use some funding to enhance engagement and experiential learning in your course or department? The following mini-grants are available through the strategic plan and Focus Indiana grant:

- Business Engagement Center Entrepreneurship Mini-Grants are available for undergraduate, graduate students, and recent graduates. Grant funds can be used to assist with starting or growing a business and range from \$200 to \$3,000. Volunteers at the South West Wildlife Conservation Center in Scottsdale helped with maintenance. They cleaned more than 20 large animal enclosures, including one for a bear. They also helped place Christmas trees in animal cages and around the center for the holidays, placed sun tarps over enclosures, filled enclosures with fresh dirt and helped clean massive areas of trail for the center. Volunteers at Sunshine Acres Children's Home in Mesa spent time in their large distribution center helping sort 1000's of items to be sold at their re-sale store and boutique. Our ISU volunteers also were able to play board and card games, play video games and talk with the children at the home. The students did an amazing job. The next Alternative Break trips will be during Spring Break. The groups will be going to Arkansas, California and Jamaica.

The destination of our summer trip is the Marine Science Center in Ponce Inlet, Florida. Students will complete beach/jetty clean up, snorkel to collect fish for exhibits, work with rays and other marine life, and, possibly, work with sea birds.
